Braid Bowling Club

The 2020 season gets under way in the third week of April, with the Men's Opening Match on Saturday 18 and the Ladies' Opening on Monday 20. From then until the end of September the green will be in use every day of the week – always subject to the weather: heavy and persistent rain can prevent or interrupt play.

From the beginning of May there are informal Mixed Play sessions, starting at 2 o'clock on Sunday afternoons. These give people wondering whether bowls might be a game for them to have an opportunity to step on the green and have a go. Apart from appropriate footwear (which is available at the Club) no special equipment is required. The Club has a range of different sizes of bowls for beginners to try before buying their own.

Throughout the season there are Mixed Play events on Friday evenings from the middle of May to the end of August and on various Saturday afternoons from May to September. Ladies have regular sessions on Monday and Wednesday afternoons, while men play on a Monday evening and Tuesday and Thursday forenoons.

In 2020 the Annual Summer Fair will be held on Saturday 6 June from 10 o'clock to 12 noon. As well as raising funds for the Club, this popular event brings together people from the area, including many who will be receiving this newsletter. Some of the regular attenders know to make a bee-line for the well-stocked cake stall, while others may prefer to try their luck at various games of chance. Club members will be on the green to encourage non-bowlers of all ages to pick a bowl and discover what the game is about. Those who opt for something more restful can buy books. And everyone can enjoy tea or coffee in the Pavilion.
