# **Subscriptions**

Please note that subscriptions for the year to  $4^{th}$  October 2025 are due by 31 March.

Details are to be found on the subscription payment sheet accompanying this letter.

New members pay a reduced subscription of £97.50 (50% of Ordinary membership) for the first year. New members applying for membership on or after 1 August in any year shall be entitled to a further reduction of 50% of the rate for new members and for the other categories of membership. This is to encourage people to join.

2025 recruitment campaign: Members recruiting a new ordinary member to the club will be awarded a cash back on their membership of £20 once the new member has registered and paid their ordinary membership fee. There will be no limit to the number of new members you may recruit and hence £20 you can claim. You and the new member need to complete the 'Recruiting Member' section on the Membership Application form.

### **Pre-Season Coffee Morning**

There will be a Coffee Morning on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> April from 10.00 am to 11.45 am when it is hoped many members will attend. New members will be particularly welcome when they will have an opportunity to meet the Club Officers and members and "try their hand" on the Green (for prospective new members there are club bowls available for use.) The pétanque court will also be open.

A joint opening day will take place on the 12 of April at 2pm.

#### Hat Nights

Men's Hat Nights will start on Monday  $14^{th}$  April and will be held every Monday evening until  $22^{nd}$  September, with signing in by 6.40 pm (by 6.25 pm from beginning of August and by 6.10 pm in September). Players of all standards will be made welcome. Each evening a charge of £2.00 per player will be made and cash prizes will be awarded at the end of the season.

Mixed Hat Nights, organised on a similar basis to Mixed Play Days and open to all members, are held on Friday evenings, beginning on  $23^{rd}$  May, and running until  $29^{th}$  August. Signing-in time for Mixed Hat Nights is 6.45pm. (6.25pm. from beginning of August). A rink fee of £4 per person will be made each evening to defray costs and there will be small cash prizes for the "highest-up rink". Those attending Mixed Hat Nights are encouraged to invite guests to join them on Friday evenings to introduce them to Bowls and to some of the members. There will be wine and nibbles in the Pavilion after the game.

#### Ladies Points Days

This Competition, played on Wednesday afternoons, starts on 16<sup>th</sup> April and continues throughout the season. Ladies wishing to play must sign in by 1.45 pm. The Ladies' Match Committee looks for good support for this Competition.

#### **Mixed Bounce Games**

Note that what was known as the men's bounce games on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 10:00 is now open to all members, now referred to as the Tuesday/ Thursday bounce games. Through this move, it is hoped that more members will make use of the green and socialise. Those turning up will distribute themselves as they wish into rinks. Play is normally ~ 1 hour followed by a tea/ coffee break following by play for the remainder of the time available.

#### **Mixed Play Days**

Throughout the year a number of mixed play days are identified in the calendar, 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 21<sup>st</sup> June, 26<sup>th</sup> July (Charity play day), and 23rd August. It is hoped that these events will be well supported by members.

### **Sunday Afternoons Informal Mixed Play**

The Sunday afternoon mixed play sessions from 2.00 pm to 4.00 pm have proved highly successful in attracting new members and will resume on Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> May. Members are encouraged to bring along friends and family. Those attending Try Bowls sessions shall be entitled to play on Sunday afternoons free of charge. Play will start at 2 o'clock with Tea/ Coffee will be available after play.

Members are reminded that the pétanque/ boules area is available for use by members, who may bring guests for £2. A key to the Old Bowls House, where the equipment is held, can be found at the back of the Bowls House.

This year, the club will be running a Pétanque championship playoff, members will be invited to register their interest. A draw will create a playoff and a trophy will be awarded to the winner.

On Sundays the University of the Third Age (u3a) has exclusive access to the Pétanque Court from 2.00 pm to 4.00pm.

### Fund Raising: 550 Club and Summer Fair

As income from subscriptions meets only the Club's ordinary running costs, all improvements to the facilities and any extraordinary expenditure have to be financed from the proceeds of the 550 Club, the Summer Fair, winter whist drives, raffles, etc.

The 550 Club will have three draws, in May, July and September, with prizes from £100.00 to £10.00 on each occasion. Draw entries costing £5.00 each are on sale from now until September but those bought prior to the May Draw will participate in all three Draws. Half the total amount invested by members is returned in prizes.

This year's Summer Fair will be held on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> June from 2 pm to 4 pm and members are invited to support this event by donating to the various stalls, by selling tickets to their friends, and by helping and/ or attending on the day. ### Security, Grounds access and Pavilion Entrance Door

The gate lock code is unchanged and the code for the Pavilion door is unchanged.

Members are reminded that under Club Rule 9.2.2, members leaving the grounds when the bowling green is not in use shall ensure that the doors of the pavilion are closed and latched and that the entrance gate is closed. Care is also required when members are upstairs or when only a few members are playing. It is essential that members continue to make sure they close the gate behind them.
